Objectives and expected results	<p>Greater awareness of national parliamentarians and parliaments of the necessity to ratify the Lanzarote Convention and/or to revise national legislation in order to make it fully compliant with the Convention, and subsequently concrete legislative initiatives taken by parliamentarians</p> <p>Greater awareness of national parliaments of the necessity to revise national legislation in order to bring it in line with the requirements of the European Social Charter (revised) as ratified by their country</p> <p>MPs awareness, knowledge and capacities are increased to step up national legislative and political action, in particular in the field of fake medicines and organ trafficking</p> <p>National laws are adopted to criminalise counterfeiting of medical products and trafficking in organs</p> <p>Awareness of climate change challenges among parliamentarians is increased, better synergies are developed with different stakeholders, and parliamentarians are better equipped with the knowledge and relevant tools to work for the implementation of the Paris Agreement at national level</p>
